## A Warm Welcome

#### **Road Safety**

# Rights Respecting Schools Article 30:

Every child has the right to learn and use the language, customs and religion of their family, regardless of whether these are shared by the majority of the people in the country where they live.

We are excited to welcome the Northern Ireland Commissioner for Children and Young People (NICCYP), Koulla Yiasouma, to our school on <u>Wednesday 6 September</u>. The Commissioner will discuss her role in safeguarding and promoting the rights of children and answer children's questions on issues that matter to them.

We are looking forward to participating in the World's Largest Lesson and supporting the Global Goals for Sustainable Development during the week <u>beginning 18 September</u>. P4 – P7 will be introduced to the Global Coals and discuss actions we can all take to help achieve them.

We are very proud of the 'Pocket Book of Rights' created by our Rights Respecting Committee. Staff, Governors and P4 – P7 children will each receive their own copy.

Each class is working on creating their Class Charter based on the UN Convention of Rights of the Child (CRC). Our Charters will set out the actions agreed between all children and adults in class to ensure that rights can be realised and enjoyed by everyone.
